REVIEW OF EXPENDITURES AND FINANCIAL REPORTS AND APPROVAL OF

CLAIMS: Sonseeahray Thayer, Senior Rate Analyst, provided the Expenditures & Financial Reports. Hoover Operations Fund Claims #13451 - #13550 and APA Fund Claim #656 for the period June 1, 2022 through June 30, 2022 were presented.

- Motion: To approve Hoover Operations Fund Claims #13451 #13550 and APA Claim #656 as presented was made by Commissioner Owens and seconded by Vice Chairman Bashaw.
- Vote: Commissioners Bashaw, Jones, Owens, Sullivan & Sweeney approved the motion.
- **Resolved:** Approved as stated above and the written documents are entered into the Commission records.

REPORT ON POWER OPERATION MATTERS: Sonseeahray Thayer, Senior Rate Analyst provided an update on power operation matters:

- Monthly Precipitation June precipitation was higher than the same time last year.
- Water Year Precipitation When we compare this water year to date to the same time period last year, overall, there has been more precipitation.
- Upper Colorado River System Precipitation to Date in the upper Colorado river system is at 96% which is considerably higher than the same time last year.
- Lake Powell inflow is forecast to be at 53% of normal for the year.
- Total System Contents (Upper and Lower basin) There was so little snow this past winter that there has not been an increase in the basins.
- Reservoir and System Capacity Currently Lake Powell is at 26% and Lake Mead is at 27% of capacity

• Lake Mead Elevation – Lake Mead is currently below 1,075. By this time next year, we anticipate the elevation to be at the 1,018 mark.

The Climate Forecast from the Colorado Basin River Forecast Center for Arizona for the next 90 days is leaning to likely above normal temperatures with a 33-40% chance of above normal precipitation over the next 3 months.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR REPORT: Jordy Fuentes, Executive Director

- Hoover Waste Site/Landfill Mitigation Update More information regarding the mitigation efforts at the waste site was provided to the contractors during a recent meeting. Many of the contractors are now working together to provide comments and ideas to Len Schilling and the Bureau of Reclamation.
- Legislative Update the legislative session has been completed with the final budget coming in at \$15 billion. The Water Bill will receive \$1.2 billion and includes \$200 million for conservation efforts. The budget also included 10% raises for all state employees. Mr. Fuentes is working with ADOA & OSPB to determine how this will impact the APA since the APA does not a receive an appropriation from the General Fund. More details to follow.
- Hoover Dam Update On Tuesday, July 19 the A5 turbine had a transformer that caught fire but was immediately extinguished. There were no injuries. The turbine will be offline until repaired and there is no reason to believe this will affect generation or the power grid at this time.

COMMISSIONER COMMENTS: Vice Chairman Bashaw thanked the Staff, Commissioners and Customers for attending the meeting in Flagstaff. He appreciates the APA joining with GCSECA for the conference and looks forward to more opportunities like this for the APA to participate.
